Queridos amigos y amigas en Cristo,

Quiero reiterar lo agradecido que estoy por su respuesta entusiasta a nuestra campaña de corresponsabilidad del 2012 y a la Campaña Anual del Arzobispo del 2011. Dear friends in Christ,

I want to reiterate how grateful I am for your enthusiastic response to our 2012 Stewardship Campaign and to the 2011 Archbishop's Annual Appeal. The outcome of both campaigns gives me confidence that we will continue our journey in faith and that we will grow in understanding what it means to be disciples of Christ.

It is true that while many people grow in their relationship with Christ and one another through their parish family, many others never really connect their experience of Sunday Mass with the rest of their lives. Many as we know, do not come to Mass very often, nor do they allow their faith to touch their lives at all.

Church professionals and pastoral leaders know the challenges as well as the benefits of providing ways to foster people's lives enrichment and faith growth. The Discipleship Initiative Commission in our parish has been considering ways to encourage all of us to live out our mission as Christian disciples. Over several months this group of parishioners has been in formation to identify their strengths and to consider the strengths and potential of our parish. We have wondered if we are asking the right questions. Instead of asking questions such as...

- Why aren't more people coming to Mass every week?
- Why aren't more people participating in parish activities?
- Why aren't more people serving in ministry?
- Why do we lose people?

our parish Discipleship Initiative Commission and I are thinking that maybe we need to ask the questions from a more positive mind set. Perhaps the more relevant questions are:

- Why do people come to Mass?
- Why do people join the parish?
- Why do they stay?
- Why do they serve?

We became convinced that the answers to these questions would tell us more about our parish and its strengths and potential than would negative variations.

With that in mind, in the coming weeks we want to ask you some important questions.
